These patients ranged from school children to families, all of whom expressed gratitude for the free treatment they received. Many had been enduring pain for an extended period, making the assistance provided by OLCAP particularly impactful and appreciated.



#### PIG REARING PROVIDES SUSTAINABLE INCOME

OLCAP's pig farming project continues to be a beacon of hope for families living in poverty, providing them with a sustainable source of income and empowerment.

Nifa recently sold one of her mature pigs and invested in two sheep, demonstrating her forward-thinking approach to expanding her potential income streams.

lliana's sow gave birth to nine piglets, presenting a significant opportunity for her family's economic advancement. By donating one pig to a new beneficiary, selling six to secure immediate income, and retaining two for breeding purposes, Iliana is effectively managing her resources for long-term sustainability.

Her plan to invest in a calf to give her milk, utilizing the proceeds from pig sales, underscores her commitment to securing additional sources of income and ensuring her family's well-being.

Her use of pig manure to fertilize her vegetable garden underscores the project's holistic approach to poverty alleviation, providing economic opportunities and enhancing food security and nutrition for families in rural Kenya.

In addition to receiving medical treatment, the patients were offered prayers for quick recovery and restoration of good health through God's grace.

They were also introduced to the saving grace of Christ and invited to participate in Bible study and prayer meetings organized by OLCAP, providing them with spiritual support and encouragement during their recovery process.

Furthermore, the patients benefited from clothes donated by the friends of OLCAP, demonstrating the organization's commitment to holistic support for those in need, addressing both physical and material needs alongside spiritual care.
